Orff Schulwerk Level I is for anyone with training in music, who wishes to further develop his/her teaching skills. This two-week intensive course will provide you with a foundation for using the Orff Schulwerk approach to teaching music and movement to children.

Through active participation in the learning process you'll develop skill in using speech, song, dance, percussion instruments and recorders for empowering students with skills and understandings for creating their own music and dance.

You'll spend the day improving your own musical skills while being presented models in pentatonic modes that will enliven your music classroom with student centered learning.

Using folk dance and folk song from diverse cultures, pieces composed specifically for Orff instruments and creative movement activities, you will improvise and create within traditional and contemporary structures. You'll also learn how to provide similar structures for creativity in your own classrooms throughout the school year.

Why Attend?

Orff Schulwerk is a unique child-centered approach to music education that makes use of children's natural affinities for moving, singing, and improvised play. Based on the work of Carl Orff, Orff Schulwerk builds musical concepts and skills through speech, poetry, song, games, and movement in a creative, playful atmosphere, where students experience the elements of music in an active way.

- Experience new activities and ideas to use with your own students.
- Share ideas that work in the classroom with other experienced teachers and with trained Orff instructors.
- Update your knowledge of current music education issues with special topics related to classroom teaching.
