

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

FOR ENTERING FRESHMAN

1. Complete an application for University admission.
2. Submit a high school transcript with a grade point average of 2.50 or higher, as well as a composite ACT score of at least 20 or a combined SAT score of at least 950.
3. Remit a non-refundable \$30 application fee.

FOR CSU AND TRANSFER STUDENTS

1. Complete an application for University admission.
2. Submit transcript: CSU students are required to have a grade point average of at least 2.50 for 12 semester hours or more of coursework; transfer students are required to submit a transcript showing a grade point average of at least 2.50. If the student has less than 30 hours of transfer credit there must be a minimum ACT composite score of 20 or a minimum SAT combined score of 950.
3. Remit a \$30 non-refundable application fee.

FOR NURSING STUDENTS

1. Complete an application for admission into Cleveland State University and the College of Education and Human Services and submit high school transcript, ACT or SAT score, with a non-refundable \$30 application fee.
2. Contact an advisor to make certain that you have met all required prerequisites.
3. Complete the separate School of Nursing application and submit with two letters of reference (included in application packet) and a \$15 non-refundable application fee.

APPLICATION MATERIALS, DEADLINES AND SUBMISSION PROCEDURES

As appropriate, students interested in the following teacher education licensure programs should apply for admission to the College of Science or the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences: all Adolescent/Young Adult programs and Multiage programs in Music, Visual Arts, and Foreign Language Education. With the exception of Music, students pursuing licensure in these areas minor in education and major in their primary teaching field (e.g., mathematics, English, social studies, Spanish). Undergraduates in all other programs major in Education.

CSU's School of Nursing offers undergraduate programs in professional nursing leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). In addition to the Basic BSN program, practicing registered nurses can obtain their BSN by completing the online RN-BSN program. The Accelerated BSN option enables students who already hold a bachelor's degree in a non-nursing field, have completed prerequisite courses, and can attend school full-time to earn the BSN in four consecutive intensive semesters. Graduates of CSU's School of Nursing are well prepared for their professional careers having received a strong theoretical and clinical foundation. The nursing curriculum provides learning opportunities that foster the development of self-direction, creativity, critical thinking, and discriminative judgment. Clinical experience is provided in a variety of community-based settings, including hospitals, nursing homes, and a broad range of health care agencies.
