

## Master of Arts in Global Interactions (MAGI)

### INTRODUCTION

The Master of Arts in Global Interactions (MAGI) is a professional master's program that prepares students for employment in private, non-profit, or governmental enterprises that have international operations. It focuses on the development of skills needed in the modern, global economy.

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The program consists of 37 credit hours, which include a core of 20 credits, a 12-credit concentration in either global business interactions or global political interactions, and an exit requirement of 5 credits.

### RESEARCH AND CREATIVE ACTIVITIES

The MAGI Program is housed in the Department of Political Science. The department has a distinguished record of publication. In the fields of international relations and comparative politics, the faculty have publications related to Asia, Africa, Europe and Latin America.

### The program's approach is based on three principles:

- **Interdisciplinary breadth:** Coursework from Economics, Communication, Political Science, Business, Modern Languages, and other departments
- **Balance:** The curriculum blends the advantages of traditional academic coursework and courses focusing on practical, problem-solving skills
- **Demand:** The program is developed in consultation with both prospective students and current employers. The resulting curriculum thus responds to the demands of our key stakeholders, and prepares students for the complexities of the global economy.

### DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the 37 credit hours in the degree, the program requires that students arrive with a basic background in economics (ordinarily, courses in microeconomics and macroeconomics). The program also requires a cross-cultural awareness component, which may or may not involve additional coursework.



Exit requirements include both an internship and a group project, in which students tackle a problem faced by an existing organization and produce a set of recommendations for the organization.
