To record and disseminate information on age-old healing traditions for the benefit of contemporary and future generations.

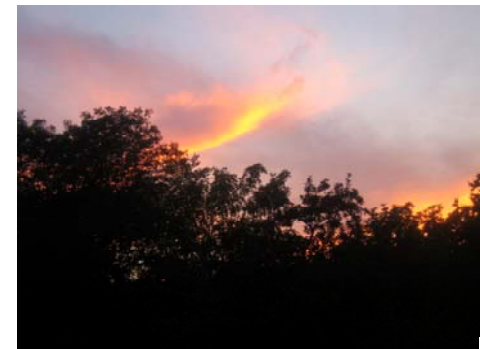
To provide opportunities for interdisciplinary investigative and learning collaborations for faculty, students and the community at large.
