Established in 1964 as a small state university, Cleveland State University (CSU) has grown into a vibrant urban campus in the heart of downtown. With over 175 academic programs and several thousand internships offered every year, students easily engage with their majors on campus and in the field.

Students at CSU learn and work alongside expert faculty who are industry professionals, from Grammy Award-winning musicians to Cleveland Clinic health professionals and Fulbright Scholars. 

JULKA HALL

- Home to CSU's education programs, Julka Hall offers state-of-the-art classrooms and learning labs
- Exceeds national exam passing rate for school teachers, counselors and administrators

MATHER MANSION

- . Built in 1910 and carefully restored to reflect it's original decor and construction
- Has 45 rooms, including a ballroom that can hold 150 guests
- Home to CSU Global, which supports our international students
- Once part of Millionaire's Row, a length of Euclid Avenue where prominent figures such as John D. Rockefeller, Marcus Hanna and Charles F. Brush built their mansions

HEALTH SCIENCES

- Houses classrooms and labs for the Occupational Therapy (OT) and Physical Therapy (PT) programs, including our Motion Analysis Lab
- Strategically located near the Physical Education building, which houses the remaining PT and OT program labs
- Constructed as an underground building as directed by former CSU President Claire Van Ummersen so that it didn't block the view of Mather Mansion

This building is much bigger than it looks. with two floors underground!

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Home to Busbey Natatorium offers swimming, diving, kayaking and scuba lessons to students
- Classes and practice space for student athletes from our 18 Division I teams, club and intramural sports

In the summer of 2013, this building was used in the filming of "Captain America: The Winter Soldier."



RECREATION CENTER

- Free for use by all CSU students who are registered for at least one credit hour
- Features three basketball courts, an indoor jogging track, cardio machines, weight training, a game floor and more

The Rec Center offers many free fitness programs to students, from yoga to spinning.

WASHKEWICZ HALL AND FENN HALL

- Home to the Washkewicz College of Engineering
- Founded in 1923, the College of Engineering is the oldest program at CSU as part of CSU's origins as Fenn College
- Washkewicz Hall includes the Parker Hannifin Human Motion and Control Laboratory and the Dan T. Moore MakerSpace, where students transform ideas into reality
- The Fenn Co-op Program offers students paid placements at engineering firms

In 2017, Stillwell Hall was renamed Fenn Hall and expanded into Washkewicz Hall, new four-story, 100,000-square-foot, \$60 million building for a revamped Washkewicz College of Engineering.

SCIENCE AND RESEARCH CENTER

- Home to biology, chemistry, neuroscience, physics and geology labs
- Opportunities for science students to work on active research projects alongside their professors
- One of only a few universities to offer real cadavers to undergraduate anatomy students

Several of our undergraduate students have had their research published in peerreviewed journals!

RONALD BERKMAN HALL

- Home to the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Honors College
- Many freshman and general education classes are held in this building
- Free tutoring is available through the Tutoring and Academic Success Center (TASC) and the Math Learning Center
- Exploratory advising and All-in-One Enrollment Services make it easy to take care of advising, financial aid and class registration in a few easy stops

Ronald Berkman Hall is one of the largest academic buildings in the state of Ohio and holds our two largest classrooms!



RHODES TOWER AND MICHAEL SCHWARTZ LIBRARY

- Rhodes Tower holds professor and advisor offices
- The library has over 125 computers for student use, plus study areas for quiet, silent and group study
- The Writing Center on the first floor helps students perfect their papers
- The Multimedia Services lab on the third floor allows students to check out cameras to work on projects

STUDENT CENTER

- Our campus "living room" there are no classrooms in this building
- Home to Viking Outfitters where you can purchase snacks, gifts, collectibles and spirit wear: Go Vikings!
- Our favorite food hub! Starbucks, Chick-fil-A and Viking Marketplace, our all-you-care-to-eat dining hall
- At Mobile Campus, students can check out a laptop, Macbook Air or graphing calculator for up to seven days free of charge

There are over 200 student organizations at CSU! Student Life Offices are on the third floor of the Student Center.

Each major has a specific librarian

to help students

with research in their area.

MUSIC AND COMMUNICATIONS

- Home to the School of Communications, the School of Music and Waetjen Auditorium, our main venue for music recitals
- Music students have the opportunity to study with members of the Cleveland Orchestra and other professional ensembles
- Contains three rehearsal halls, two chamber music rehearsal rooms, three electronic music labs, dozens of practice rooms and a professional recording studio

BERT L. WOLSTEIN HALL

- Home to the **College of Law**, a nearly 120-year-old institution
- The first law school in Ohio to admit women and among the first in Ohio to admit minorities
- Real legal work as part of the curriculum for hands-on experience assisting individuals and causes
- Law opens doors to careers in business, non-profits, public service, sports and entertainment, as well as traditional law firm litigation

School of Music is part of CSU's Arts Campus along with School of Film & Media Arts, Department of Art and Design, and Department of Theatre and Dance.



College of Law boasts a first-time bar passage rate of 84.6% and remains in the top 100 schools for health care law, intellectual property law, international law and legal writing. U.S. News & World Report



ARTS CAMPUS

Our Arts Campus flourishes in the heart of Playhouse Square, the nation's largest performing arts center outside of New York City. It features the Tony Award-winning Cleveland Play House, America's only professional theatre company coupled with an undergraduate university learning environment. The Arts Campus includes over 120,000 square-feet of studios, rehearsal space, classrooms and production shops, with faculty from the top arts institutions in town. It also includes the School of Film & Media Arts — Ohio's first standalone film school.

RESIDENCE HALLS

CSU's residence halls provide community living experiences with apartment-style amenities. Each hall includes social lounges, study spaces, a fitness center, free laundry, community building events, and staff is on-site 24 hours. Fenn Tower (Tour Stop 1) and Euclid Commons (Tour Stop 19) are reserved for first-year students and lower classmen. Added in 2023, upper classmen can choose to live in The Edge on Euclid (Tour Stop 17), located on the western edge of campus, or The Langston (Tour Stop 8), just north of Washkewicz Hall. CAREER SERVICES

Careeer Development and Exploration (CDE) helps students find jobs on campus and at nearby businesses. Students can set up an appointment with a career counselor for services such as resume writing assistance and mock interviews. CDE hosts a job fair every semester in the Student Center, bringing in 100+ local employers to recruit CSU students and recent graduates.



CAMPUS SAFETY

Cleveland State University takes every necessary measure to keep our students, faculty and staff safe. Our campus is protected by the CSU Police Department, who patrol over 90 acres of campus on foot, bicycle and patrol car. They also offer Viking Safety Escorts to increase safety and security when walking on campus. In addition to emergency bluelight phone stations around campus, students can also download the free Rave Guardian mobile app to notify authorities in case of an emergency.

COMMUTING TO CAMPUS

For many students, CSU is only a quick, convenient RTA ride away. Each student is provided an RTA pass that they can use to commute to campus, or for personal use such as visiting attractions like Little Italy, Edgewater Park, Westside Market and more! We also have a number of parking options inside our on-campus garages.

WOLSTEIN CENTER

CSU's event arena just south of campus brings entertainment right to our door. Come cheer on our Viking basketball teams or catch year-round entertainment from concerts to Cirque Du Soleil. Wolstein Center also hosts CSU's commencement ceremonies.
