1. To begin, you must go to the Google Play Store. Search for **Microsoft Outlook**. Install the app.

3. Select **Exchange** from the Screen and enter in your CSU email and Campus Password. Another screen will appear and enter the following:

Username: Your CSU ID # @ csuohio.edu



Name: Whatever you choose to call your email account (optional)




- 4. Press **Activate** for this screen.
 - a. This screen states that if you were to lose or have your phone stolen, we are able to remotely wipe your phone. Please note that you might be required to setup a pin/password to access your phone.

5. Although not required, it will prompt you to encrypt your android phone. If you would like to, select **Enable Encryption**, otherwise. Select **Not Now**.

Note: If your device is not protected (e.g password, passcode, pin or pattern) you will get a message to promt you to set a device password. Please select the password of your choosing to continue to this screen.








1. Open up **Settings**. Then select **Security**.




2. Select **Device administrators**


