### In addition to the General Education and Psychology Major requirements listed on the above tables, students must earn:

- A minimum of 42 total credit hours of 300/400 level coursework (referred to as the "upper division requirement")
  - o CSU PSY courses at the 300/400 level will apply to this requirement
  - o Upper division coursework transferred from another university will apply to this requirement
  - $\circ \hspace{0.5cm}$  Upper division electives can be taken at Lakeland, online or at a CSU campus
- A minimum of 120 total credit hours (including all eligible transfer credits from Lakeland and all credit earned at CSU) AS OF FALL 2014
- A total of 30 credit hours of study must be taken through Cleveland State of which at least 24 must be upper division credits
- At least 18 Psychology credits must be taken through Cleveland State

#### Partnership Hints

- When applying to CSU you must complete the Application Supplement for Partnership Admission form
- Financial Aid can only be used at one institution at a time.
  - Associate of Arts requirements are not listed on this guide
  - Consult with a Lakeland Community College Counselor to verify requirements for Associate of Arts degree
