In addition to the items listed above, students must earn:

- A minimum of 42 total credit hours of Junior/Senior (CSU 300/400) level courses (referred to as the "upper division requirement")
 - o CSU PSY courses, online or on campus, at the 300/400 level will be applied to this requirement
 - Upper division coursework transferred from another college or university will apply to this requirement
- A minimum of 120 total credit hours (including all eligible transfer credits from LCCC and all credit earned at CSU)
- Residence Requirements: A total of 30 credit hours of study must be taken at Cleveland State, of which at least 24 credit hours must be upper division coursework at Cleveland State, 18 credits toward major must be through Cleveland State

Partnership Hints

- When applying to CSU you must complete the Application Supplement for Partnership Admission form
- Dually enrolled students using financial aid should complete the Consortium Agreement each semester
- Have LCCC transcripts sent to CSU after each semester you attend classes at LCCC
- ##Lorain partnership students interested in graduate study may want complete PSYH 277 from LCCC, which offers students an opportunity for a more in-depth, autonomous experience in conducting psychological research
- Complete a CSU graduation application with your CSU advisor the semester before you plan to graduate
