## SUGGESTED SEQUENCE AT CSU

Acceptance into the B.A. program in Music at CSU requires an interview with the program advisor and written confirmation from the program advisor of the student's acceptance as a candidate for the B.A. in Music. A successful entrance audition before a faculty committee is required of students whose focus in the B.A. program is to be performance. An entrance audition will also be required of applicants who have less than one year of private applied lessons at a recognized institution of higher education.

\*Not required for students whose applied instrument is Piano.

\*\*Depending on prior musical training/skill level, students may need to take MUS 1200, 1210, and 1220 prior to enrolling in these courses. Contact the Music Department for skill assessment.

$\diamond$ Students must complete 18 elective credits in music, at least 15 of which must be at the 300-400 level. Although a student is free to complete the major requirements with any combination of Music electives, the department believes that the major program is greatly strengthened and better organized when there is judicious selection of electives. The department makes available to every student who declares a major in Music an Undergraduate Advisor. The student is expected to plan a total academic program with the assistance of the department advisor.

Assumptions: college-level readiness in MATH and ENG; no Foreign Language Deficiency (FLD). NOTE-this is different from the Foreign Language Requirement (FLR) which is a requirement in the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences at CSU.

CSU requires a minimum of 120 total credit hours for graduation. At least 30 credits must be completed in-residence at CSU. At least 24 of the in-residence credits must be completed at the upper division (300/400) level. An overall total of 42 upper division (300/400) level credits are required. Students deficient in total credits or in-residence must take additional elective credits to meet the minimum requirements. Depending upon other elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above, or may need additional electives.

Students who do not complete the Associate of Arts degree are responsible for the completion of the entire General Education Requirements at Cleveland State University.

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This map represents one example of how to complete the AA and BA degrees. Students should work closely with counselors/advisors at both institutions to discuss options.
