The CSU TRIO McNair Scholars Program assists undergraduate students with their academic development and prepares them for doctoral studies. In order to help the students achieve their goals, the program supports and sponsors undergraduate experiences to produce highly competitive students who have all of the necessary skills for graduate school. These experiences include attending seminars, advising, preparation for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), and involvement in research. Students who participate in the program come from disadvantaged backgrounds, show strong academic potential in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics) disciplines, and are committed to pursuing a Ph.D. degree. The McNair Scholars program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education and Cleveland State University. The program is named after Dr. Ronald E. McNair, an African American physicist and NASA astronaut who died in the Challenger explosion in 1986.
