\*Associate of Arts degree requires completion of 61 semester credits with a 2.0 minimum grade point average. Students must successfully complete at least 36 of the total minimum 61 credits required for the degree from the courses listed in the Transfer Module.

\*\*Lakeland Community College strongly recommends students select two from the following options: HIST1150 or HIST1450, HIST1250 or HIST1550.

\*\*\*If foreign language is not selected, students may select a general elective but should be aware additional credits may be required to reach the 61 credit hour minimum to earn an AA degree.

\*\*\*\* Lakeland Community College strongly recommends students select from the following list to complete the requirement: HIST2150, HIST2750, HIST2250, and HIST2600.

^Arts & Humanities requirement: select at least 6 credits from at least two disciplines.

^^Lakeland Community College strongly recommends MATH1550.

^^^Admission to History major: student must obtain an "Entrance Interview" packet from the History Department in RT1319 and follow the stated procedures. Also, no course with a grade below a C may be counted toward the history major.

#### **Additional Information**

Assumptions: college-level readiness in MATH and ENG; no Foreign Language Deficiency (FLD). NOTE-this is different from the Foreign Language Requirement (FLR) which is a requirement in the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences at CSU.

CSU requires a minimum of 120 total credit hours for graduation. At least 30 credits must be completed in-residence at CSU. At least 24 of the in-residence credits must be completed at the upper division (300/400) level. An overall total of 42 upper division (300/400) level credits are required. Students deficient in total credits or in-residence credits must take additional elective credits to meet the minimum requirements. Depending upon other elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above, or may need additional electives.
