HEATHER LENNOX was appointed to the Cleveland State University Board of Trustees as a Community Board Member on June 20, 2017 for a two-year term ending on June 30, 2019.

Ms. Lennox is the Partner-in-Charge, Cleveland Office, Jones Day global law firm. She is a partner in the firm's Business Restructuring and Reorganization Practice, and has played a leading role in Jones Day's representations of debtors and potential debtors, creditors' committees, prepetition secured lenders, bank groups, DIP lenders, credit card processors, and other significant creditors in many of the nation's largest in-court and out-of-court corporate and municipal restructurings. Ms. Lennox made headlines as one of three Jones Day lawyers who led the City of Detroit's high-profile exit from its \$18 billion in debts in December 2014, the largest municipal bankruptcy case in U.S. history.

Ms. Lennox has coauthored bankruptcy-related articles published in *The Business Lawyer* and the *Journal of Bankruptcy Law and Practice* and is a conferee of the National Bankruptcy Conference (2012-present); a Fellow in the American College of Bankruptcy; and a member of the American Bankruptcy Institute, the Cleveland Metropolitan Bar Association, and the New York City Bar Association.

Lennox grew up in Cleveland, graduated from Holy Name High School and John Carroll University, and received her juris doctorate from Georgetown University Law Center. She began work for Jones Day upon graduation.
