## How to Launch a Blackboard Collaborate Session (Mac)

First time Collaborate users *may* need to download the **Blackboard Collaborate Launcher** to open the session. Only users who have **OS X 10.8.4 and newer** will need the **Launcher** (i.e. Mountain Lion and Mavericks) due to security changes Apple has made to its most recent operating systems. *Once you have the Launcher installed, you do not need to download it again*. To determine if you need the **Launcher**, follow these steps:

- Check your version of **OS X** by clicking on the **Apple** symbol ( **(**) in the upper left and selecting **About This Mac**.
- In the About This Mac window, look for Version 10.X.X, where each X represents a number.



- If you see 10.5.X, 10.6.X or 10.7.X, you *will not* need the Launcher and can open the Collaborate session without any further action (*Note*: Should you download the Launcher anyway, the .zip file will be unusable). Simply double click on the downloaded meeting.jnlp file to begin (File will be downloaded in Step 4).
- If you see 10.8.X or 10.9.X, you will need the Launcher and can download it by clicking here (download will start immediately). Once this program has been downloaded, unzip the file (if necessary). Next, follow the instructions below for your browser.

After you have confirmed your operating system and downloaded the **Launcher** (if necessary), follow the instructions to open a Blackboard Collaborate session.



  - a) <u>Safari</u>: After you click on Log In in Step 2, a pop-up window may appear asking if you have downloaded the Collaborate Launcher. If you already downloaded the Launcher, click I already have this, Launch to download the meeting.jnlp file.


In the upper right of the browser window, click on the **Downloads** icon and double click on **meeting.jnlp**. This will open **Launcher** and begin the Blackboard Collaborate session.



b) <u>Chrome</u>: After you click on Log In in Step 2, a pop-up window may appear asking if you have downloaded the Collaborate Launcher. If you already downloaded the Launcher, click I already have this, Launch to download the meeting.jnlp file.



You will be prompted with a download window at the bottom left of the screen. Click on **Keep**.



The file will then download. Once it has finished, click on **meeting.jnlp** to launch the Blackboard Collaborate session.



c) <u>Firefox</u>: After you click on Log In in Step 2, a pop-up window may appear asking if you have downloaded the Collaborate Launcher. If you already downloaded the Launcher, click I already have this, Launch to download the meeting.jnlp file.



A pop-up window will appear. Make sure **Open With** is selected and click **OK**.
