GROWTH	CSU welcomed 2,000 first-year students to campus this fall, a new record and the university's tenth straight year of enrollment growth.
OUTCOMES	CSU was ranked 18th in the nation and No. 1 in Ohio for excellence in social mobility and impactful research in a July 2017 report by the Brookings Institution.
STUDENT SUCCESS	In recognition of its student success initiatives, CSU received the Excellence and Innovation Award for College Completion from the American Association of State Colleges and Universities.
RESEARCH	The National Science Foundation ranked CSU No. 1 in the nation for increases in research expenditures between fiscal years 2004 and 2013.
ROI	CSU alumni earn \$10,000 more by mid-career than comparable graduates from other schools, according to the Brookings Institution.
FUNDRAISING	CSU raised \$114M in the first ever university campaign, exceeding the original \$100M goal and completing the campaign two years ahead of schedule.
DIVERSITY	CSU received the 2017 Higher Education Excellence in Diversity (HEED) Award presented by INSIGHT Into Diversity magazine. This is the fourth year in a row CSU has been selected as a HEED recipient.
ENGAGEMENT	In recognition of its outstanding connectivity with and impact on the community, CSU received the Community Engagement Classification from the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, a designation bestowed upon fewer than 400 institutions nationwide.
STABILITY	In 2016, CSU received an A+ bond rating from Standard & Poor's and an A1 rating from Moody's.







About Cleveland State University

Founded in 1964, **Cleveland State University** is a public research institution with 17,000-plus students, 10 colleges and schools and more than 175 academic programs.

Today, the University encompasses:

These academic units offer programs leading to Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral degrees.

CSU has received national recognition for innovative programs that help students save time and save money while earning a degree. **Multi-term registration** allows students to plan an entire academic year in advance. With **demand-driven enrollment**, students are notified of openings in courses at full capacity as soon as spots become available. And with CSU's **adjusted tuition band**, students can take up to six three-credit-hour courses per semester at the same cost as four courses.

These measures are saving time and saving money for CSU students, who graduate with the second-lowest student debt among graduates of Ohio public four-year institutions, according to The Institute for College Access & Success. CSU students also have the second-lowest student default rate in Ohio among publics, according to U.S. Department of Education data.

Year after year, CSU is listed among America's best universities by *U.S. News & World Report*, which also consistently includes CSU programs in business, health sciences, urban affairs and other disciplines among the finest in the nation in its *Best Graduate Schools* rankings.

CSU students graduate with the hands-on experience they need to thrive in rewarding careers. The secret of their success? It is called Engaged Learning, and it combines higher education and real-world experience to create one-of-a-kind opportunities. CSU delivers 3,000+ co-ops and internships – more than any other Ohio public university – at nearly every major corporation and organization in Cleveland and beyond, connecting students with invaluable opportunities in technology, manufacturing, health care, finance, education, and other industries.





Deeply woven into the fabric of Northeast Ohio, CSU has cultivated a wide variety of partnerships with neighboring institutions across the region, benefitting the campus community as well as the community at large. In collaboration with Northeast Ohio Medical University, CSU is preparing a more diverse workforce of health professionals to address the unmet health-care needs of urban neighborhoods. Together with the Cleveland Metropolitan School District, CSU has developed an Education Park that is challenging young students from kindergarten through high school with an International Baccalaureate curriculum at Campus International School and a rigorous secondary education focusing on science, technology, engineering and math at MC2STEM High School. Created in partnership with Playhouse Square and Cleveland Playhouse, the CSU Arts Campus allows theatre and dance students to hone their craft amid the largest performing arts center outside New York City – and soon will be home to CSU's new School of Film & Media Arts, the first of its kind in Ohio. Opportunities abound to expand partnerships with world-class organizations in Cleveland.

A \$500 million architectural reboot has reinvigorated CSU's 85-acre campus in downtown Cleveland, complete with new buildings and inviting spaces that reflect and embrace the excitement of the urban landscape. Among them are the Center for Innovation in Medical Professions, designed to embrace an interprofessional approach to health-care education, and a 100,000-square-foot addition to the Washkewicz College of Engineering that will include classrooms, labs and a state-of-the-art makerspace.

The revitalization evident across the CSU campus is having a dynamic ripple effect and sparking neighborhood development in and around Cleveland's bustling Campus District, including new residential complexes and retail spaces.

CSU's combination of cutting-edge scholarship, academics, career readiness and educational innovation in a vibrant and engaged community on an upward trajectory highlights why the University is now considered a leading urban research university.

CSU's hometown is the 32nd largest metro area in the U.S., with more than 2 million residents – nearly 400,000 of which are living in the city of Cleveland itself. Stretching along the shore of <u>Lake Erie</u>, the Northeast Ohio region spans 18 counties with close to four million residents building their lives in diverse <u>urban</u>, suburban and <u>rural</u> communities.

Area residents benefit from great schools and neighborhoods, a low cost of living, a reliable network of <u>public</u> <u>transportation</u> and short commutes. Ethnic diversity and an array of proud, storied cultures give Cleveland its unique personality. Our region embraces nearly 120 ethnic groups that speak more than 60 languages, as well as historic neighborhoods thick with cultural influence such as Little Italy and Slavic Village, where the old world meets the new.

A remarkable abundance of <u>cultural</u> and <u>recreational</u> resources punctuate Cleveland's unique position as a **"big small city,"** with the assets and amenities that can be found in larger metro areas but at more affordable prices and in a more navigable footprint.

What kind of amenities are we talking about? For starters, there's the legendary Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, set against the backdrop of the vast and beautiful Lake Erie. We have three professional sports teams located downtown: MLB's Cleveland Indians, NFL's Cleveland Browns, and NBA's Cleveland Cavaliers. Just next door to the CSU campus is Playhouse Square, the largest performing arts center in the nation outside of New York City, where you'll find newly renovated theaters packed with musical performances and Broadway hits, including national tour openers. Nearby is University Circle, where you can visit the spectacular (and free) Cleveland Museum of Art, the Cleveland Botanical Garden, the Cleveland Museum of Natural History, and the Western Reserve Historical Society's Cleveland History Center – all within steps of one another. One of the top orchestras in the world – The Cleveland Orchestra – plays just down the street at Severance Hall.

Speaking of art, the dishes prepared by Cleveland's cadre of award-winning and nationally recognized <u>chefs</u> are works of creative genius as well. Throughout the city, inspired <u>culinary minds</u> are sharing exciting and inventive dishes that pay homage to the city's ethnic heritage.

Did you know Cleveland's nickname is Forest City? There's a reason for that. The city is **surrounded by greenspace** and has an array of outdoor activities that are extremely rare in a city of its size. The award-winning <u>Cleveland Metroparks</u> has been named one of the best park districts in the U.S., complete with an extensive system of nature preserves that span 23,000 acres and include more than 300 miles of walking, biking and bridle trails as well as numerous picnic areas, nature education centers and golf courses. The region also includes the nationally acclaimed Cleveland Metroparks Zoo and the 32,500-acre <u>Cuyahoga Valley National Park</u>.

But of course, it can't be all play all the time. Clevelanders know nothing is free and everything is earned—that's why the city is chock **full of hard-working, bright minds**. In fact, 60 percent of all U.S. Fortune 500 companies are located in the region, including General Electric, Parker Hannifin and Progressive Insurance. Northeast Ohio boasts \$226 billion in gross regional product, making us the 16th largest economic region in the nation. The city also is home to the world-renowned <u>Cleveland Clinic</u>, one of the top-ranked hospitals in the nation, and <u>The Cleveland Foundation</u>, a widely recognized nonprofit organization and the first community foundation in the United States. A vast network of support organizations for entrepreneurs fosters a **healthy start-up scene**, with education, industry, investment and research institutions all working together to create nothing short of magic.





And <u>Cleveland is just getting better</u>. From 2014 to 2015, Cleveland gained 23,000 jobs, its largest year-over-year job growth since 1997 and the fourth highest gain in the nation. In addition, Cleveland ranked eighth nationally in a 2016 study that ranked cities across the nation on their ability to attract millennial professionals.

To set the stage for the next generation, Cleveland is committed to education, particularly in the urban core. CSU is a partner in the Higher Education Compact for Greater Cleveland. Launched in 2011 by Cleveland Mayor Frank Jackson with the support of civic leaders, educators, and college and university presidents, the compact seeks to increase college readiness, access and success for Cleveland students. The Cleveland Metropolitan School District and the nonprofit organization Say Yes to Education have begun laying the groundwork for a partnership that would provide free college tuition for all district graduates, starting in 2019.

For all of these reasons and more, *Men's Journal* ranks Cleveland as one of the "50 Best Places to Live." The city is also No. 12 on *Travel + Leisure*'s list of "America's Most Cultured Cities." The accolades continue to come in for this city situated on the crooked Cuyahoga River.

Position Overview

The President is appointed by and reports directly to the Cleveland State University Board of Trustees. In this role, the President is responsible for providing transformative leadership, focus and strategic vision for CSU, in collaboration with the Board.

The President administers and orchestrates all operations and programs of the institution. The President provides executive oversight in continuing the expansion of student success, academic research and other institutional initiatives, identifies and effectively communicates appropriate goals and objectives for the University and successfully leads the planning and implementation processes to include various constituencies. The President develops and implements plans and policies to ensure that the University remains in compliance with accreditation requirements. The President ensures proper administration of the financial affairs of the University, actively working with the Board and executive team to ensure that the institution acquires the necessary public and private resources for successful achievement of the University's goals and objectives and engages in fundraising activities that increase the University's endowment.

Additionally, the President is expected to fully support and help bring to fruition the University's Strategic Plan.

President Role Specifications

The Board seeks an individual with demonstrated leadership and administrative abilities who can shape, articulate and implement the dynamic mission of a large public university, along with knowledge of and/or experience with the





business operations of large and comprehensive organizations. It is desirable that the President hold an earned doctorate or terminal professional degree, along with an appropriate blend of experiences, including executive/academic leadership at the highest levels. Nontraditional candidates will be considered.

Excellence in the following areas will be important to the success of the next President of CSU:

STUDENT SUCCESS

- The President will fully commit to the concept of a student-centered institution, with a strong student orientation and a dedication to preparing students for success in a global environment.
- Specific accomplishments related to the academic and job placement success of minority students are highly desirable.
- The President will foster growth in student enrollment, student retention rates, academic programs and elevation of the academic profile of incoming students, in cooperation with the Faculty Senate within a shared governance environment.

FACULTY

- The President will welcome the opportunity to represent the work of a diverse, talented, world-class faculty.
- The President will bring a passion for building partnerships with faculty to ensure the University's success.
- The President will possess an understanding of tenure and promotion, along with the skill and discernment to nominate members of the faculty and administration and make recommendations to the Board for the award of tenure for faculty members.

STAFFING

• The President will participate in all major hires made at CSU and will inspire institutional accountability, efficiency, fiscal responsibility and the ethical and effective performance of all leaders and divisions in the University.

DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

• The President will foster and champion a diverse student, faculty and staff population, and encourage cultural diversity throughout the institution's curriculum, activities and community involvement.

INNOVATION

• The President will reimagine higher education from the inside out, and position CSU as a best-in-class urban institution nationally and among the top Ohio public universities.

RESEARCH

• The President will showcase nationally and internationally recognized research by the current faculty and will develop the faculty to further enhance CSU's prominence as a research leader among Ohio universities.

ATHLETICS

• The President will provide for the proper administration and oversight of the operations of the Department of Athletics and ensure that the University's intercollegiate athletic programs and activities adhere to the highest standards of integrity as well as the rules and requirements of the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

FINANCIAL OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT

• The President will possess the financial acumen required to manage a financially complex institution and ensure proper administration of the financial affairs of the University.

FUNDRAISING

• The President will provide visionary leadership for fundraising efforts, oversee successful capital campaigns and work in collaboration with institutional advancement to oversee growth of a giving and donor development program.





- Experience facilitating public/private partnerships to achieve fundraising objectives is desirable.
- The President will encourage personal philanthropy across the institution and develop the fundraising and leadership capacities of academic deans and other leaders throughout the organization.

PARTNERSHIPS

- The President will advance and fortify alliances with business, industry, government, arts, academia and community groups and inspire commitment in CSU alumni to participate in the life and future of the University.
- The President will ensure that the University is a leader in urban, metro area and regional economic development and will help to establish, direct and maintain excellent community relations.

POLITICAL LEADERSHIP

• The President should have an understanding of the governmental and legislative process and possess the skills to successfully navigate a political system to ensure that legislative goals on the state and federal levels are identified and met.
