## College/ Program Notes:

The plan above is a suggested guide to ensure that all General Education, College, University, and Major requirements are met within 3 years of study. Students may deviate from the suggested placement of Gen Ed courses, although the M/QL and W/C requirements should be completed during the first year of study.

\*General Electives ensure that a student accumulates the minimum credit hour totals needed for graduation. Students must have a minimum of 120 total credit hours, of which a minimum of 42 credit hours must be upper division (300 or 400-level courses). Depending upon other elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above, or may need additional electives. In order to enter the Cleveland-Marshall College of Law in the 4th year and graduate with a B.A. in Criminology after successfully completing the first year of law school, a student must have earned 91 credit hours at the undergraduate level, and have finished their University General Education requirements, College requirements, and Major requirements.

INTRO = Introduction to University Life Requirement (one course)

W/C = Writing/Composition Requirement (two courses; C or better required)

M/QL = Mathematics/Quantitative Literacy Requirement (two courses) NS = Natural Sciences (two courses, one of which must have a lab)

SS = Social Sciences Requirement (2 courses from different departments\*\*) A&H = Arts & Humanities Requirement (2 courses from different departments\*\*)

DIV = Social Diversity Requirement (2 courses; one US Diversity and one African American Exp.)

WAC/SPAC = Writing/Speaking Across the Curriculum Requirement (3 courses, one in the major) CAP = Capstone Requirement

\*\* of the SS and A&H courses, one must be focused on Africa, Latin America, Asia or the Middle East (ALAAME)
