Dr. Shree Walker is the current Director of Section 504 and Special Populations for Metropolitan Nashville Public Schools in Nashville, Tennessee, and an Adjunct Professor at Belmont University. Dr. Walker utilizes practical resolutions to support all diverse learners. She investigates and responds to the Office for Civil Rights or district level complaints that involve

administrators' complaints while working to resolve any alleged issues of noncompliance. Dr. Walker also designs innovative leadership development models to support staff development and educate them on the best practices regarding compliance matters. She received a Doctorate of Curriculum and Instruction from Tennessee State University in 2017, a Masters of Special Education from Lipscomb University, and a Bachelor's of Arts in History from Fisk University. Dr. Walker worked as an Exceptional Education Teacher at the Jere Baxter Alternative Learning Center and Hillsboro High School where she served as the department Chair of Exceptional Education for both schools. Her article "University Community Partnerships in Teacher Preparation" was published in the Journal of Public Scholarship in High Education in 2016. Dr. Walker is the author of the book *Resilient Walker* which was published in 2018. Finally, she participated in a public education leadership project with Harvard University in 2018.
