*Associate of Arts degree requires completion of 61 semester credits with a 2.0 minimum grade point average. Students must successfully complete at least 36 of the total minimum 61 credits required for the degree from the courses listed in the Transfer Module.

**If foreign language is not selected, students may select a general elective but should be aware additional credits may be required to reach the 61 credit hour minimum to earn an AA degree.

***Arts & Humanities requirement: select at least 6 credits from at least two disciplines.

^Lakeland Community College strongly recommends students select courses from the following to complete the requirement: ENGL2250 or ENGL2280, ENGL2260 or ENGL2290, HIST2150 or HIST2250.

^^Must complete course with a grade of "C" or higher.

^^^English Literature requirement: of the five classes, at least one must be a British literature class and one must be an American literature class.

^^^Lakeland Community College strongly recommends ENGL2210, ENGL2220, or ENGL2230..

Additional Information

Assumptions: college-level readiness in MATH and ENG; no Foreign Language Deficiency (FLD). NOTE-this is different from the Foreign Language Requirement (FLR) which is a requirement in the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences at CSU.

CSU requires a minimum of 120 total credit hours for graduation. At least 30 credits must be completed in-residence at CSU. At least 24 of the in-residence credits must be completed at the upper division (300/400) level. An overall total of 42 upper division (300/400) level credits are required. Students deficient in total credits or in-residence credits must take additional elective credits to meet the minimum requirements. Depending upon other elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above, or may need additional electives.

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This map represents one example of how to complete the AA and BA degrees. Students should work closely with advisors at both institutions to discuss options.
