## **CSU Campus Visit Pre-Screening Checklist**

## Complete at home prior to visit. (This involves researchers, research assistant and human participants)

Researchers, research assistants (who may be students) and human participants should assess their health prior to coming to the CSU campus, and are to stay home when sick or if they demonstrate the following symptoms. Researchers and research assistants are to notify their immediate direct report. Researchers, research assistants and human participants are to stay home and monitor these symptoms. If these worsen call your health care provider.

- 1. Fever 100.4F or over
- 2. Cough
- 3. Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- 4. Fatigue
- 5. Muscle pain (if worse than usual or change, if unsure call researcher/research assistant)
- 6. Headache
- 7. Sore throat
- 8. Congestion or runny nose
- 9. Nausea or vomiting
- 10. Diarrhea
- 11. Loss of smell or taste

Researchers, research assistants and human participants should look for emergency warning signs of COVID-19. If someone is showing any of these signs, seek emergency medical care immediately:

- 1. Trouble breathing
- 2. Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- 3. New confusion
- 4. Inability to wake or stay awake
- 5. Bluish lips or face
