### About the Program

The Ohio Means Internships and Co-Ops program will provide new internships and co-ops for CSU Students. It is funded by a grant awarded by the [Ohio Board of Regents](#) (OBOR). Cleveland State University and seven partnering intermediaries have pledged to develop 125 new [internships](#) and 25 new [co-op](#) positions. Ohio Means Internships & Co-ops grant mission is to build systems to sustain co-ops & internships and to build the capability and capacity of programs to engage more students, more businesses and more faculty members in co-op and internship programs.

### Wage Reimbursement

The OMIC program is committed to reimburse up to 25% of student intern wages to participating businesses. Proposed intern pay ranges from \$10 to \$17 an hour for a limited period of time Suggested: At least 10 weeks of full-time employment or 20 weeks of part-time employment.

## REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE

### Employers

- For profit companies must fall within the required [nine targeted industry clusters](#) or [four business functions](#), below.
- Be registered to do business in Ohio and have a principal place of business in Northeast Ohio.
- Jobs are required to be “new”, which is defined as either a job offered by an employer who
  - a) Has no history of a CSU specific co-op or internship program since 2008, or
  - b) Who creates a net increase of positions during a given semester compared to a CSU predetermined baseline
