Purpose

Promote scholarship of teaching and learning at Cleveland State University

Focus on faculty interested in creating or revising a course using current education research

Priority given to revitalizing a 100-200 level course with enrollment of 100 or more students per academic year (across all sections)

Proposal should address how the pedagogy used will foster student success and enhance retention; addressing how these changes will decrease DFW rates

Who is Eligible to Apply?

- ▶ Teams of at least 2 full-time faculty members
- ▶ Includes tenured faculty, tenure-track faculty, and college lecturers

Key Elements of the Proposal

- ▶ Provide an overview of your project that explains the significance of this course to student retention and success at CSU
- ▶ Document the details of common issues with the existing course or a curriculum issue that a new course might address
- ▶ Outline the changes you will implement
- ▶ Discuss the potential impact and desired outcomes for these changes
