Pre-requisites (students who do not meet these pre-requisites may need to complete additional credits) :

College-ready in MATH and ENG; 2 years of the same foreign language completed in high school

^A minimum of 11 credit hours of PSY Electives must be taken total.

*Grade of "C" or higher required.

**Psychology In-Major Residence Requirement - At least 18 credits of the major must be earned in residence at CSU. In addition, at least 12 of these credits be upper division (300/400-level).

***Note: one additional credit hour may need to be taken to reach the 60 hour credit minimum if 4 credit hour Natural Science/lab course is not selected.

Additional Information:

- A student who majors in psychology should seriously consider taking courses in such disciplines as biology, anthropology, mathematics, sociology, and the philosophy of science.
- Any student who plans to pursue graduate study in psychology should obtain a solid background in statistics, research methods, and experimental psychology.
- Any student who plans to apply to graduate programs in psychology should consult an adviser to appropriately structure an undergraduate program of study.

Students who plan to complete an AA at Tri-C, then transfer to CSU to complete a BA are encouraged to enroll in the Tri-C/CSU Dual Enrollment Admission program. This map represents one example of how to complete the AA and BA degrees. Students should work closely with counselors/advisors at both institutions to discuss options

Students who do not complete the Associate of Arts degree are responsible for the completion of the entire General Education Requirements at Cleveland State University.

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CSU requires a minimum of 120 total credit hours for graduation. At least 30 credits must be completed in-residence at CSU. At least 24 of the in-residence credits must be completed at the upper division (300/400) level. An overall total of 42 upper division (300/400) level credits are required. Students deficient in total credits or in-residence must take additional elective credits to meet the minimum requirements. Depending upon other elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above, or may need additional electives.
