CSU announces additional \$6 million in direct aid to students

Funds will support Lift Up Vikes! Emergency Grant Program

Cleveland State University will award an additional \$6 million in need-based emergency grants to help CSU students manage financial challenges occurring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Grants of up to \$2,500 will be available through the Lift Up Vikes! program, an existing student support initiative which provides emergency grants to CSU students. Funding for this additional distribution will come from both recently-allocated Federal CARES Act resources and generous donors. These grants can be used for expenses such as housing, food, course materials, technology and childcare.

"Getting funds to our students quickly and efficiently is our highest priority," said CSU President Harlan M. Sands. "And helping students reduce financial obstacles is critical if we are to keep students on a pathway to graduate."

Emergency grants will be available to students through the CSU Office of Financial Aid. Eligibility will depend on student circumstances. Fully-automated grant applications will be available beginning Monday, April 27, directions and updates will be posted to https://www.csuohio.edu/coronavirus-update/coronavirus-update.

The CSU Lift Up Vikes! program has been providing emergency grants since its establishment in 2019, and new contributions from a variety of donors and supporters since the outbreak of COVID-19 have increased availability of funding. 

These QR codes feature two Magnus head designs and one portrait of President Harlan Sands, for you to make paintings and clothing for your character. Just save the images attached below to download these designs!

Before you can download one of our two Magnus designs, or your very own portrait of President Sands onto your copy of Animal Crossing: New Horizon, you'll need the Nintendo Switch Online app for Android or iOS. Once you log in with your Nintendo account, you'll be able to access Nook Link. Press the Plus button on the New Horizons title screen to link your character with your Nintendo account, and use the app to scan the QR code.

After you scan it, open your designs on your Nook Phone and press the Plus button to download the design.







For a CSU hoodie that players can use for their characters in the game. These are the instructions for obtaining this design:

How to search for your own CSU Hoodie!

- 1. Go to the Able Sisters clothing store.
- 2. Head to the back and interact with the pink kiosk.
- 3. Access the kiosk and then wait for your Switch to connect to the internet.
- 4. Select Search for Design.
- 5. Enter the ID: MO-4TXT-JOVD-LX5C (Design IDs always start with MO-).
- 6. Select Confirm. Your game will search for the code and then bring up the hoodie for you to download. Then, select Save.
- 7. Select Close.
- 8. Select a PRO Pattern that you're willing to overwrite.
- 9. Select Overwrite it.




Student Organization Registration

The registration period for next school year (2020-2021) is under way! To help with this process, the Center for Student Involvement hosted a Zoom meeting to walk through the steps to register for next school year. If you missed that meeting, a recording is on Student Life's YouTube channel. The link to that recording is: https://youtu.be/9 pGWNKGkjA.

As a reminder:

- **DO NOT** register your organization **UNTIL** you have held your officer elections for next year. **Please be** aware that the Officer Update Form will NOT be available during the registration period.
- While not mandatory, if you choose to use VikesConnect for officer election, instructions to accomplish
 this is found here: https://engagesupport.campuslabs.com/hc/en-us/articles/204033084-Creating-an-Organization-Election
- Once your officer election has been held, work with the new officers on a transition plan. We have provided some helpful guidelines for you which is located in the RSO Resource Manual (https://vikesconnect.csuohio.edu/organization/student-life/documents/view/1459107) starting on page 45, Appendix C: Student Organization Transition Plan.
- For your organization to be eligible to request an information table at Magnus Fest and the Fall Student Organization Fair, your organization must complete the re-registration process by Friday, July 31, 2020.
- To re-register your organization, your organization's page in the "Manage" view will look like this:



- To begin the process, simply click on the blue "RE-REGISTER THIS ORGANIZATION" button on the page.

 Only currently listed officers and your advisor will have the ability to register your organization.
