Admission Procedures

Applications should be submitted no later than six weeks prior to the beginning of the term. Complete admissions information can be found at the website listed below or call 440-366-4850.

1. A completed Cleveland State University Undergraduate Admission Application along with a Partnership Application Supplement Form must be submitted. Forms are available at the Cleveland State Partnership office at Lorain County Community College in the University Center building, room 113, or online at www.csuohio.edu/campuses/lorain/. Applications can also be obtained online at: www.csuohio.edu/admissions/transfer.
2. Official copy of transcripts sent directly from each regionally-accredited college or university attended.

Credit for Life Experience

Individuals with substantial experience in nonprofit administration may qualify for up to 24 semester hours in life experience credit, which will be applied to the major. The amount of credit to be granted is determined by portfolio analysis, and a two-credit prerequisite course (UST 190 Assessment of Experiential Learning) is offered each Fall and Spring Semester via the Internet. Earn an Associate in Applied Science in Human Services and then transfer to CSU's Levin College of Urban Affairs. Technical courses will be accepted. Credit for life experience is an option for individuals with extensive work experience or specialized training.

Most Partnership students need to complete University General Education (Gen Ed 08) requirements by taking appropriate Lorain County Community College courses. The academic advisor will help students determine what Gen Ed categories remain unfulfilled. Generally, Partnership students should take the following courses at LCCC:

URBS 151	Introduction to Urban Studies (Social Science)
MTHM 151	College Math (Math/QL) <i>OR</i> MTHM 131 Introduction to College Math
RELG 181	Comparative World Religions OR MUSC 262 Music as a World Phenomenon OR other as listed in the transfer guide to fulfill Non-U.S. Arts/Humanities: Africa, Asia, Latin America, Middle East Culture
GPHY 151	Human Geography to fulfill Non-U.S. Social Science

Other courses from the transfer guide to fulfill Gen Ed areas, as required.

Curriculum: CSU courses needed to complete the major in Nonprofit Administration are offered through the University Partnership on a regular basis. Students pursuing Credit for Life Experience should meet with the CSU academic advisor to determine how that credit will apply to the Nonprofit Administration major.

CSU and the Levin College require 128 semester hours for graduation, 36 hours of which must be in upper division (300-400) level courses. All students who graduated from high school in 1987 or later must have completed two years of one foreign language in high school. Students who did not do so must complete a first-year foreign language sequence, or take two semesters of American Sign Language and one approved foreign culture course.

In order to fulfill CSU's residency requirements for the B.A., University Partnership students must complete a minimum of 30 semester hours in CSU course offerings.
