

The China in the Global Economy: Language, Culture, and Business program provides 4 credits of Chinese language and 4 credits in Chinese culture or business while in one of the most significant countries in the world!

This program offers a first-hand opportunity to learn Mandarin Chinese, understand China's growing role in the contemporary global economic and political arenas, discover the rich cultural history and heritage of the Chinese people, and explore the contemporary Chinese society. The highlight of the course is a four and a half week visit to China, featuring Chinese language classes, company visits, guest lectures, tours of some of the major historical and cultural sights.

During the visit, students live and study in the Capital University of Economics and Business (CUEB) in Beijing. In Beijing, students will visit the Summer Palace, Forbidden City, Temple of Heaven, Olympic sites, and the Great Wall.

Following four-week long intensive language study in Beijing, the course will be concluded with five-day cultural, historic, and business visits to Xi'an and Shanghai. Xi'an is the capital of 12 dynasties; it is the eastern terminus of the Silk Road and the home of the Terracotta Warriors. Shanghai is the financial center of China, a nexus of Chinese tradition and European style influence.

Academic Program

Students will be able to earn a total of 8 credits during this four and half-week program. All participants will take Chinese language classes at CUEB (4 credits) and are required to take a four-credit CSU field studies.

The students will choose from the following two specialized tracks:

- **Track 1** China in the Global Economy: BUS/FIN 493; MBA/FIN 693; INB 491
- **Track 2** Chinese Language, History, Culture and Contemporary Chinese Society: MLA 240/340/440

Following a four-week long intensive study and field trips in Beijing, the course will be concluded with five-day cultural, historic, and business visits to Xi'an and Shanghai.

Eligibility

Applicants must have a minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of 2.0; graduate cumulative GPA of 3.0.

At the time of application, the applicant must have completed two semesters at CSU if a first year student, and one semester if a transfer or graduate student. Students from other universities may be accepted to the program as a CSU transient student. Must also have no unpaid balance on their Treasury Services account and have no infractions of the Student Code of Conduct. All applications must be approved by the Program Director and the Education Abroad office.

Cost

The **\$4300 program fee** includes:

- round trip **airfare** with the group flight
- hotels, entry fees, guides, and transportation on all **excursions**
- **lodging** in a hotel on the CUEB campus
- **CUEB tuition** (4 credits)
- a **Chinese visa**
- an **International Student ID Card**

The cost does not include CSU tuition for BUS/FIN 493, MBA/FIN 693, INB 491, or MLA 240/340/440. To view the current tuition rates, go to www.csuohio.edu/tuition. The cost may change due to increases in airfare and/or the exchange rate.

Students should budget an additional \$300 for meals. Students can eat at the CUEB international student dining hall or buy food from a variety of cafeteria or restaurants on or off campus.

Students are also responsible for passport fees, health insurance, and personal souvenir purchases and sight-seeing.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

Students may use summer financial aid to pay for all CSU fees except the deposit. If you have any questions about using financial aid toward the study abroad cost, please contact the Education Abroad office.

Three scholarships are available to students on the CSU in China program. Eligible students can apply for the CISP Study Abroad Scholarship, the ODAMA Study Abroad Scholarship, and the Confucius Institute Scholarship.
