

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES at Levin.

The M.A. in Environmental Studies prepares students for careers in environmental policy and management. This program is interdisciplinary, with coursework in public policy, planning, public and nonprofit administration, science, engineering and law. It is a collaboration between the Levin College of Urban Affairs, the College of Sciences and Health Professions, the Washkewicz College of Engineering, and the Cleveland-Marshall College of Law.

The graduate Environmental Studies curriculum encompasses the development of the human institutions, organizations, and behaviors that restore and protect the environment. It entails study of both natural and human systems and their interdependence. Students acquire skills that “bridge the gap” between environmental scientists, engineers, and public policy professionals to promote wise decisions that protect the integrity, diversity and resilience of ecological systems and foster sustainable settlements.

Our graduates pursue a wide range of professional careers in the public, private, and nonprofit sectors that share a commitment to environmental sustainability.

Students complete 44 credit hours, including core courses, an exit project, and electives from five areas of specialization:

- + Policy and Administration
- + Environmental Planning
- + Geographic Information Systems (GIS)
- + Environmental Nonprofit Management
- + Sustainable Economic Development

GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Graduate Assistantships and scholarships are competitive, and are awarded to qualified students who have been admitted to Urban Affairs graduate degree programs. Candidates must have an undergraduate or graduate GPA of 3.0 or higher to qualify for and retain a graduate assistantship.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to the M.A. in Environmental Studies program must meet the minimum requirements established by the College of Graduate Studies and the M.A. program faculty:

- + A minimum undergraduate grade-point average of 3.0.
- + Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores, with an average Verbal and Quantitative score at the 40th percentile, and an Analytical Writing score of at least 4.0. Students with a graduate degree from an accredited U.S. college or university are exempted from this requirement. Other standardized admission examinations may be substituted at the discretion of the Program Director.
- + Two letters of recommendation, preferably from faculty.
- + Non-native English speakers must demonstrate English-language proficiency.
